

Role of State DHLs

- Act as communication link
- Collaborate with state organizations
- Promote evidence-informed information and materials





Minimum Requirements for DHLs



Maintain ADHA membership



Complete quarterly reports



Respond to requests in a timely manner



Send monthly e-mail to stakeholders



Attend quarterly DHL calls/webinars



Submit annual expense allowance request, when eligible



Submit one presentation proposal

DHL At-A-Glance Activity Guide

Required Activities

Activities are identified by the following categories:

AC = Access to Care AD = Administration CO = Collaboration AS = Assessment ED = Education PR = Prevention

Monthly

- ED: Send e-mail to state partners (e.g., Head Start association, Head Start collaboration office, oral health program, oral health coalition) and Head Start staff with relevant oral health information and resources. ED: Respond to information requests in a timely manner.

Quarterly

- ED: Participate in a call with your regional DHL coordinator.
- ED: Participate in a DHL webinar or listen to an archived webinar posted to the DHL webpage. AD: Complete a progress report

Progress report due dates:

☐ 1st quarter report—due January 7 (Oct–Dec) ☐ 3rd quarter report—due July 7 (Apr-Jun) ☐ 2nd quarter report—due April 7 (Jan-Mar) ☐ 4th quarter report—due September 15 (Jul–Sep)

Annually

- ED: Submit a proposal to present at a state meeting using NCHBHS-approved presentation slides.
- AD: Request an annual expense allowance once activities in three categories are completed.
- CO: Maintain American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) membership. (DHL expense allowance can be

Other Activities: Examples by Category

AC: Facilitate access to oral health care.

Collaborate with state groups (e.g., dental association, oral health coalition, primary care association) to recruit health professionals to provide oral health care to Head Start participants.

AS: Promote awareness of Head Start Program Information Report (PIR) oral health data.

Review PIR oral health data to identify state trends and potential issues related to meeting the Head Start Program Performance Standards, and share key findings with state partners.

CO: Foster communication with DHL project leadership, DHLs, and Head Start staff.

- Participate in the DHL discussion list, read messages, and share information and resources.
- Participate in state <u>health managers networks</u> and share information and resources.
- Attend DHL events at national conferences (e.g., ADHA, National Oral Health Conference), as personal funding

ED: Share oral health information and NCHBHS resources with Head Start staff and state

- Submit a proposal to present at a state meeting using Office of Head Start (OHS)-approved presentation slides.
- With guidance and approval from the NCHBHS oral health management team, present at a regional meeting
- Prepare a newsletter article using content from NCHBHS oral health resources and share it with state partners.

PR: Encourage preventive oral health.

- Promote toothbrushing in Head Start and Early Head Start programs—ideally group toothbrushing at the
- Promote use of fluoride in Head Start programs (e.g., brushing with fluoride toothpaste, drinking community

Promote receipt of fluorides (e.g., fluoride varnish, silver diamine fluoride) in dental, medical, and other settings.

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

Dental Hygienist Liaison Projects

Because of the importance of oral health during pregnancy and early childhood, in 2011 the National Center on Health, working in partnership with the American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA), created the Dental Hygienist Liaison (DHL) project. Under the DHL project, one dental hygienist from each state volunteers to help promote oral health for pregnant women and children enrolled in Head Start. The DHL project continues as part of the Office of Head Start– currently funded through the National Center on Health, Behavioral Health, and Safety (NCHBHS). The National Maternal and Child Oral Health Resource Center is the project lead for NCHBHS oral health activities and works in partnership with ASTDD, which coordinates the Dental Hygienist Liaison Project.

Role of the Dental Hygienist Liaison

DHLs promote oral health in Head Start by:

- Providing a communication link between NCHBHS and Head Start agencies in their states
- Collaborating with state organizations such as oral health programs, Head Start collaboration offices, and Head Start
 Associations
- Providing oral health presentations at state conferences and meetings
- Moffering strategies to improve access to oral health care for pregnant women and children enrolled in Head Start
- Working with oral health professionals to establish partnerships with local Head Start programs
- Sharing information about the importance of oral health and regular oral health visits, good nutrition and oral hygiene practices, and oral-injury-prevention strategies with Head Start program staff
- Serving on Head Start committees (e.g., Head Start health manager networks, Head Start health services advisory committees) and oral health advisory boards and coalitions to promote the oral health of Head Start participants
